Holiday Inn Norwich City is a 5-minute walk from the stadium and offers lobby Wi-Fi, a restaurant, bar/lounge, 24-hr room service and meeting rooms, while The Norwich Hotel on Thorpe Road is a 7-min walk away and comes with free Wi-Fi and parking, bar/lounge, meeting rooms and 24-hr front desk.Spend the afternoon at Norwich Castle Museum & Art Gallery and take a tour of the Keep. Then spend the night at The Maids Head Hotel in Tombland with free Wi-Fi and parking, a restaurant, bar/lounge and café. The hotel is less than 0.5 km from the Castle. Or, you can opt for the Stracey Hotel on Strand Road which is just over 1 km away and also has free Wi-Fi and parking in addition to a restaurant, bar/lounge, garden and tour assistance desk.First-time visitors may wish to reserve a room at one of the several hotels in the city centre. A good choice is the Best Western Annesley House Hotel on Newmarket Road, a 15-min walk from the city, offering free Wi-Fi and parking, a restaurant, bar/lounge, garden and laundry services. Alternatively, there is the Best Western George Hotel, also with free Wi-Fi and parking, a restaurant, bar/lounge and it is a 17-min walk from the city centre.If you're planning to visit the University of East Anglia campus there is a limited number of hotels to choose from. Best Western Plus Oaklands Hotel is about 7 km away and offers free Wi-Fi and parking, 2 restaurants, a bar/lounge, terrace and garden. There is also The Old Rectory Hotel at Crosswick, also with free Wi-Fi and parking, a restaurant, bar/lounge, outdoor pool, garden, and is just over 10 km from the campus.Earlham Park is a 20 acre Nature Reserve for a fun day out with the entire family and there are a couple of good hotels nearby. Best Western Brook Hotel Norwich has free Wi-Fi and parking, breakfast, a restaurant, bar/lounge and 2 children under 12 stay free when staying in same room as their parents/guardian. Mercure Norwich Hotel on Boundary Road offers similar facilities along with an indoor pool and connecting rooms. Both hotels are within 3.5 km of the reserve.Food lovers visiting Norwich will find numerous street stalls selling delicious world cuisine and local delicacies at Norwich Market. For Norwich hotels nearby try the Premier Inn Norwich Nelson City Centre, which is situated around a 15min walk or a 5min bus ride on line 8 from the site.If you're flying into Norwich late and want to stay close to the airport, the Premier Inn Norwich Airport is located just a 5min walk from the terminals and has a Park & Ride stop nearby that connects with Norwich city centre.If you're visiting Norwich on a budget, try booking a hotel just outside of the city centre and on the south bank of the River Yare. Norwich hotels in this vicinity, like The King's Arms and the Namaste Palace Hotel, tend to be slightly cheaper than hotels located in the centre.Barnham Broom Hotel, Golf and Spa has an on-site golf course along with 24-hr room service, an indoor pool, full-service spa and steam room in addition to free breakfast. Wi-Fi and parking, a restaurant and 2 bars/lounges. There is also Sprowston Manor Hotel and Country Club which offers a restaurant, bar/lounge, indoor pool, on-site golf course with valet parking and is 4.2 km from NWI Airport.Staynorwich Apartments is located a 7-min walk from Norwich Station and has lobby Wi-Fi, a bar/lounge, garden, laundry services and airport shuttle. Alternatively, there is the Silver Hill House on Silver Road, also with lobby Wi-Fi, bar/lounge, self-parking, a garden and is a 23-min walk from Norwich Station and a 15-min walk from Norwich Cathedral.The Assembly House on Theatre Street offers free full breakfast, Wi-Fi and parking, a restaurant, a bar/lounge with business centre and meeting rooms and it is a 3-min walk from Norwich City Hall and Norwich Guildhall. Another option is Holiday Inn Norwich North with free Wi-Fi and parking, restaurant, bar/lounge, indoor pool with business centre, conference and meeting rooms and it is a 4-min drive from NWI Airport.Felbrigg Lodge Hotel on School Road offers free English breakfast, free Wi-Fi and parking, a restaurant, indoor pool, meeting room and garden along with on-site spa services and hot tub. This hotel is 30 kilometres from the city centre, 6.1 km from Priory Maze and Gardens and a 30-minute drive from NWI Airport.If you're looking for Norwich hotels with a traditional English pub on-site, the Old Ram Coaching Inn is a great choice for you. This hotel has a charming rustic feel and is located around a 30min drive from Norwich city. Perfect if you want to enjoy the sights during the day then relax in the countryside at night.The Blue Boar Inn has a children's play area in the hotel garden. It is also located just a 5min walk from Blue Boar Lane Park, which also has a kid's adventure play area. You can reach the city centre from the Blue Boar Inn by car in around 15min or take the 11A bus line.Visitors to Norwich will find plenty of hotels that cater to large parties or that offer facilities for large-scale events, such as weddings or anniversary celebrations. Dunston Hall Hotel, Golf and Spa Resort, caters for weddings and parties and is an exquisite country manor located just a 10min drive from the city. Meanwhile, the Links Country Park Hotel also has a conference room for large groups and is around a 50min drive from Norwich centre.KAYAK users like staying at Riverside Hotel Bed and Breakfast, Travelodge Norwich Central Riverside and The Maids Head Hotel when looking for a hotel in close proximity to Norwich City Centre.After you launch a hotel search on KAYAK, you can refine your research by neighbourhood, which allows you to pick the central Norwich districts. Popular choices among KAYAK users include OYO Elm Farm Country House, Norwich Airport, The Town House by Innkeeper's Collection and The Manor Hotel. Once an important medieval trading centre, Norwich remains a popular shopping destination. The Chapelfield centre is the newest addition, whereas a historic shop sells the city's most famous export: Colman's Mustard. Castle Mall is underground, in a hill topped with a keep, part of the 12th-century castle founded by William the Conqueror. Dating to the same era is the large cobbled square housing a 6-day market. It was said that Norwich had a church for every week, and while that is no longer true, over 30 medieval churches still exist. The cathedral was built using stone from Normandy and boasts England's 2nd largest cloisters and 2nd tallest spire.Colourful medieval façades line Elm Hill and the Guildhall is another fine example of the period. Half-timbered Dragon Hall was a trading hall, while St Andrew's and Blackfriars Halls constitute England's most intact friary. The 14th-century Cow Tower sits by the River Wensum upstream from Pulls Ferry, the train station and Norwich City FC.Reportedly, Norwich once had a pub for every day, and today's traditional inns and modern bars are certainly popular with the student population. Other entertainment options include the Theatre Royal and Playhouse.Norwich accommodation on Booking.com includes historic hotels with pools, city centre guest houses and riverside apartments, all near to Norwich Airport. It was during the Norman period that the city really came of age, becoming the second largest city in England up until the industrial revolution cause it to be displaced. Norwich holds several attractions dating from Norman times, including the lovely Norwich Cathedral. Modern developments and the large student population of the University of East Anglia keep things fresh. Norwich has a cosy and vibrant city centre and a reputation as one of the most ecologically conscious cities in the United Kingdom.A Compact Centre Ideal for WalkingSpecial efforts have been made in the Norwich city centre to ease pedestrian travel, allowing those on foot to get around as part of the city's strong "green" commitment. A good place to start a walk around Norwich would be in the streets surrounding Norwich Castle. These streets are home to some of the city's best hotels, restaurants and nightlife. Due to the city centre's compact size, it's usually a simple matter to walk back to your hotel after a visit to one of the pubs or clubs.Norwich Market is a lively outdoor market dating from the 11th century. It is one of the largest markets in the UK and consists of more than 200 stalls selling food, crafts, flowers and more. It is in the very heart of the city, adjacent to Gentleman's Walk, which itself is home to many boutiques and luxury stores.Castle, Cathedral and 900 Years of HistoryThough Saxons were living in the area for some time before the cathedral was built, it was the building of Norwich Cathedral 900 years ago that was the initial impetus to the city's growth. The development of the Cathedral catapulted Norwich into becoming the second largest city in the British Isles, a position it maintained for centuries. Constructed mostly in the Norman period, the cathedral's interior is both simple and inspiring, with visitors eyes being directed heavenward to the massive vaulted ceiling. It is especially well known for its cloisters, the covered walkways which offer wonderful views of the gardens and spire. Norman settlements required solid defences, with the order to construct Norwich Castle having come from William the Conqueror himself. While relatively modest in size, the castle benefits from being right in the city centre, close to the city's best hotels and guest houses. The attached museum includes exquisite art objects dating from Queen Boudica's time to the present day.A Vibrant Arts and Cultural CentreNorwich has a strong history of supporting the arts, culture and learning. The city was the site of the first provincial library, which opened in 1608, and has maintained a strong publishing industry and literary scene up to the present day. The people of Norwich and municipal authorities have made a strong commitment to free speech, which has helped the arts flourish. The main cultural event on the calendar is the Norfolk and Norwich Festival. This festival features a variety of artists and performers who showcase their work and talent each May. It is especially well-known for its musical acts, but also includes theatre, dance and other visual arts as well. The Norwich Theatre Royal has an extensive program featuring operas, plays, musicals and much more. The Forum is a striking modern complex right in the centre of the city close to many hotels. It offers a casual atmosphere to enjoy art exhibitions, outdoor shows and an award winning library all in one place. The city also has a number of professional sports teams, including the very popular Norwich City Football Club, which is known for its friendly fans. Norwich Rugby Football Club is a smaller outfit and plays its games at grounds near Norwich Airport.A Base for Exploring the East Anglia CountrysideVisitors to Norwich who get a little tired of city life can easily make quick daytrips into the East Anglia countryside and coast to revive their spirits. Recently rebranded as the Broads National Park, this lovely area of lowland rivers and lakes is popular with day trippers from the city. Many of its waterways are navigable, with small sailing craft being a particularly popular choice among those looking to get out onto the water. The area is also well known for its historic windmills, constructed to help process the wheat grown in the region. The endless beaches of the East Anglia coast are also very popular, with Great Yarmouth being the destination of choice for many.
